Containers

- #3,#5, #7,#10, #15 all refer to the size of the container and loosely correspond to gallons. Containers are above-ground, soft-sided, root-pruning bags which minimize circling roots and future problems. **Containers must be removed with a sharp utility knife before planting.**
- **Knit bags** are special in-ground root-pruning fabric containers which concentrate the roots inside the bags and more roots means healthier plants and successful transplanting. **Since trees in knit bags are in the ground, they should be dug and transplanted when dormant, usually early spring (before bud break) and late fall (after a frost).** 12” knit bags weigh approximately 60 pounds. **Knit bags must be removed with a sharp utility knife before planting.**
- **RS - Means recently shifted- into a bigger rootrapper to increase root mass- may not be completely rooted out until end of growing season- can still plant**

Plants are sold in good health with **no guarantee.**

carpinus, witch hazel, flowering dogwood, sweetgum, washington hawthorn.**
